#### CONDITIONS OF THIS AUTHORIZATION

- 1. **False Information:** The holder is prohibited from knowingly giving false information. To do so will be considered a breach of conditions and be grounds for revocation: [RE: 36 CFR 2.32(a) (3)].
- 2. Legal Compliance: The holder shall exercise this privilege subject to the supervision of the area Superintendent. The holder shall comply with all applicable laws and regulations of the area and terms and conditions of the authorization. The holder must acquire all permits or licenses of State or local government, as applicable, necessary to provide the services described above, and, must operate in compliance with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws and regulations, including, without limitation, all applicable park area policies, procedures and regulations. All vehicles/vessels/aircraft are required to be registered and the operators are required to have the proper licenses to operate them commercially, as required by law or regulation.
- Rates: The holder shall provide commercial services under this authorization to visitors at reasonable rates satisfactory to the area Superintendent.
- Operating Conditions: The holder shall provide the authorized commercial services to visitors under operating conditions satisfactory to the area Superintendent.
- 5. Liabilities and Claims: This authorization is issued upon the express condition that the United States, its agents and employees shall be free from all liabilities and claims for damages and/or suits for or by reason of any injury, injuries, or death to any person or persons or property of any kind whatsoever, whether to the person or property of the holder, its agents or employees, or third parties, from any cause or causes whatsoever while in or upon said premises or any part thereof during the term of this authorization or occasioned by any occupancy or use of said premises or any activity carried on by the holder in connection herewith, and the holder hereby covenants and agrees to indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless the United States, its agents, and employees from all liabilities, charges, expenses and costs on account of or by reason of any such injuries, deaths, liabilities, claims, suits or losses however occurring or damages growing out of the same.
- 6. Insurance: Holder agrees to carry general liability insurance against claims occasioned by the action or omissions of the holder, its agents and employees in carrying out activities and operations under this authorization. The policy shall name the United States of America as additional insured. Holder agrees to have on file with the park copies of the above insurance with the proper endorsements.
- 7. CUA Fees: At a minimum, the holder shall reimburse the park for all costs incurred by the park as a result of accepting and processing the application and managing and monitoring the authorized activity. Administrative costs for the application process must be paid when the application is submitted. Monitoring fees and any additional costs incurred by the park to support the commercial activity will be paid annually or on a more frequent basis as determined by mutual agreement between the Holder and the area Superintendent.
- 8. Benefit: No member of, or delegate to, Congress, or Resident Commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this authorization or to any benefit that may arise from this authorization. This restriction shall not be construed to extend to this Contract if made with a corporation or company for its general benefit.
- 9. Transfer: This authorization may not be transferred or assigned without the written consent of the area Superintendent.
- 10. Termination: This authorization may be terminated upon breach of any of the conditions herein or at the discretion of the area Superintendent.
- 11. **Preference or Exclusivity:** The holder is not entitled to any preference to renewal of this authorization except to the extent otherwise expressly provided by law. This authorization is not exclusive and is not a concession contract.
- 12. **Construction:** The holder shall not construct any structures, fixtures or improvements in the park area. The holder shall not engage in any groundbreaking activities without the express, written approval of the area Superintendent.
- 13. Reporting: The holder is to provide the area Superintendent upon request a statement of its gross receipts from its activities under this authorization and any other specific information related to the holder's operations that the area Superintendent may request, including but not limited to, visitor use statistics, and resource impact assessments. The holder must submit annually the CUA Annual Report (NPS Form 10-660) and upon request the CUA Monthly Report (NPS Form 10-660A).

- 14. **Accounting:** The holder is to maintain an accounting system under which its accounts can be readily identified within its system of accounts classification. This accounting system must be capable of providing the information required by this authorization. The holder grants the United States of America access to its books and records at any time for the purpose of determining compliance with the terms and conditions of this authorization.
- 15. **Minimum Wage:** The holder must comply with all provisions of Executive Order 14026 of April 27, 2021, (Increasing the Minimum Wage for Federal Contractors) and its implementing regulations, including the applicable contract clause, codified at 29 C.F.R. part 23, all of which are incorporated by reference into this authorization as if fully set forth in this authorization.
- 16. Visitor Acknowledgment of Risks (VAR): The holder is not permitted to require clients sign a waiver of liability statement or form, insurance disclaimer, and/or indemnification agreement waiving the client's right to hold the CUA holder responsible for accidents or injury occurring on NPS property. The holder is permitted to request or require a client to sign a form or statement acknowledging risk and/or indicating that certain prerequisite skills may be needed to participate in the commercial activity. The holder must provide the park with the current copy of all forms and/or statements used for this purpose and obtain written approval by the park to use the form and/or statement. - 17. Intellectual Property of the National Park Service: Except with the written authorization of the Director of the National Park Service, the Holder shall not assert any legal claim that the Holder or any related entity holds a trademark, tradename, servicemark or other ownership interest in the words "National Park Service", the initials "NPS", or official name of any unit or part thereof, including but not limited to any facility, logo, distinctive natural, archaeological, cultural, or historic site, within the National Park System, or any colorable likeness thereof, or the likeness of a National Park Service official uniform, badge, logo, or insignia.
- 18. **Nondiscrimination:** The holder must comply with Applicable Laws relating to nondiscrimination in providing visitor services to the public and with all equal employment opportunity provisions of Title VII of the Civil Rights Act, as amended.
- 19. **Notification of Employee Rights:** The holder must comply with all provisions of Executive Order 13496 of January 30, 2009, (Notification of Employee Rights Under Federal Labor Laws) and its implementing regulations, including the applicable contract clause, codified at 29 CFR part 471, appendix A to subpart A, all of which are incorporated by reference into this authorization as if fully set forth in this authorization.

# SPECIAL PARK CONDITIONS 2023 Guided Bicycle Tours; Drop off and Pick up Bike Service

#### Section A - Guided Bicycle Tours; Drop off and Pick up Bike Service

1. **CM** Check the following website for COVID-19 updates:

2. RM The CUA Holder is required to submit a trip itinerary, including dates, times, locations, and routes to the Acadia National Park Commercial Use Program Coordinator. Any changes to the itinerary must be submitted at least seven (7) dates prior to the proposed trip.

3. Roup size on **Mount Desert Island** is **limited** to Twenty (20) per group (including guides). To limit resource damage, congestion, and to provide for a high-quality experience, groups with more than ten participants are required to split into smaller groups and avoid grouping together along trails, parking areas, and overlooks. Carpooling is encouraged.

Provide Number of Participants including Guides typically 7; max 20

- 4. Group size in the **Schoodic District** is limited to 15 participants including the guide(s) unless the groups are participating in pre- arranged programs with the National Park Service staff or Schoodic Institute staff at the Schoodic Education and Research Center (SERC) campus or (2) sponsored programs with National Park Service staff or Schoodic Institute staff at the Schoodic Education and Research Center (SERC) campus. Additional restrictions may apply for group size in excess of 15 participants including the guides.
- 5. Only Class 1 Electric Bicycles (E-Bikes) are authorized on the historic carriage roads. All classes of E-Bikes are authorized on roads open to motor vehicle traffic.

## 6. RM Support Vehicles & Snack Stops

- a. The following areas are designated for Support Vehicles & Snack Stops: Fabbri Picnic Area, Bear Brook Picnic Area, Seawall Picnic Area, Pretty Marsh Picnic Area, and Thompson Island Picnic Area.
- Non-picnic areas suitable include (1) paved pullout on State Route (SR) 3 across from the Kane Path/Cannon Brook Trailhead, (2) Schooner Head Overlook Parking Lot, or (3) Otter Point Parking Lot.
- c. Support vehicles shall not pace group and shall use designated paved pullouts.
- d. All vehicles and trailers must stay on established roadways.

7. ?M Bicycles are not permitted on hiking trails.

## 8.RM Trailers:

- a. CUA Holders' transporting bicycles and equipment on trailers are prohibited from using dead end roads.
- b. For **guided bicycle tours**, long-term parking (more than 1/2 hour) of trailers and vehicles is only authorized at the Hulls Cove Visitor Center and in designated signed parking spaces for trailers.
- c. For bike drop-off and pick up services, there is a time limit of not more than 30 minutes at the Hulls Cove Visitor Center for parking, loading, and unloading of bicycles and equipment in designated signed parking spaces for trailers. Long-term parking is prohibited at all other access points to the historic carriage roads.

- 9. <u>Rn</u> Private carriage roads located between Northeast Harbor and Seal Harbor, concentrated around Little Long Pond are located outside of the park and are closed to bicycle use.
- 10. Safety: Guides must brief all riders on the proper and safe procedures for controlling bicycles. The wearing of bicycle safety helmets while riding is mandatory.

## 11. RM Paved Roads:

- a. Cyclists must obey all traffic laws and have all required safety equipment including lights.
- b. Cyclists must ride single file to the right and observe one-way traffic regulations.
- c. Cyclists must not bunch up in groups blocking paved roads or impeding traffic

## 12.7M Historic Carriage Roads:

- Speeding and reckless operations are prohibited. The speed limit for any use on the carriage roads is 20 MPH.
- Traditional pedal bicycles and Class 1 E-Bikes are authorized.
- c. Cyclists are required to maintain control and be prepared to stop at all times.
- d. Keep to the right.
- e. Warn others when passing from behind and give them plenty of space.
- f. Ride or walk your bike no more than two abreast.
- g. Do not obstruct the road.
- h. Move to the side when stopping.
- i. Cyclists must yield to walkers and horses.
- When approaching horses or carriages from the front, cyclists must keep to the far right and be prepared to stop.
- k. When passing horses/carriages from behind:
  - i. Slow down
  - ii. Make contact with the rider to alert the horse of your presence
  - iii. Wait until it is safe to pass (watch for oncoming riders, curves, and hills)
  - iv. Pass on the far left, allowing plenty of space ("passing on your left")
  - v. Respect equestrian requests
  - vi. For carriages, wait for a signal from the driver to pass.

13. Park Entrance Fees are required to enter Acadia National Park (Park): Clients will pay the per person rate if they don't already possess any park entrance pass. Please refer to the following website for additional information:

- a. The drivers and the guides have free entry into the park and shall not use their own passes to cover the clients' fee.
- b. Clients may use their annual or federal recreational lands passes according to the parameters of the pass.
- c. Only clients 16 years old and over are required to pay the park entrance fee.
- d. Regardless of the portion of the park visited, park entrance fees are applicable and are in accordance with current regulations.
- e. As a condition of this CUA, the CUA Holder is responsible for ensuring that their clients know that fees are required prior to entering any portion of Acadia National Park and they must inform their clients where entrance fees can be purchased.
- f. The CUA Holder may be cited for failure to comply with this CUA condition, and the client may be cited for failure to pay the park entrance fee.
- g. All operators must obtain the Park entrance pass.
- h. Fees can be paid at (1) Sand Beach Entrance Station and (2) Hulls Cove Visitor Center. For dates and hours of operations particularly in the off season please check the following website:

i. Park entrance passes or the complete CUA must be displayed and clearly visible in the vehicle.

## 14. RM Loading and Unloading:

- a. Loading and unloading are authorized at the Thompson Island Regional Chamber of Commerce and Park Information, Hulls Cove Visitor Center, Eagle Lake Boat Launch Parking, Jordan Pond Boat Launch Parking, Norumbega Parking, and Brown Mountain Parking area and is limited to thirty minutes or less. CUA Holders are prohibited from loading and unloading in the Island Explorer Bus Stop.
- b. Authorized in designated paved parking spaces
- c. Prohibited on shoulder roadways
- 15. **RM** Island Explorer Bus Stop: No vehicle is authorized to park in the designated stop for the Island Explorer.

- 16 M Designated Bus Zones/Spaces: No vehicles except for busses and motor coaches are authorized to park in designated bus parking zones/spaces
- 17. A Temporary Stop: A temporary stop without loading and unloading of passengers is authorized at these locations:
  - a. The right lane of the Park Loop Road between Bear Brook Picnic Area and the Stanley Brook Road, unless otherwise posted.
  - b. Paved Pull Outs
- 18. Unpaved Roads: Vehicle travel on unpaved surfaces is prohibited with the exception of the gravel access road (Stable Lane) to Wildwood Stables.

#### Section B: Schoodic District Special Park Conditions

- Motor vehicles are restricted to vehicles with a capacity of 15 passengers or less unless the groups are (1) participating in pre-arranged programs with the National Park Service staff or Schoodic Institute staff at the Schoodic Education and Research Center (SERC) campus or (2) sponsored programs with National Park Service staff or Schoodic Institute staff at the Schoodic Education and Research Center (SERC) campus.
- 2. Motor vehicles with the capacity of 15 passengers or less are authorized to load and unload participants, guides, and equipment at Frazer Point and Schoodic Woods Day Use Area except in an emergency situation other locations may be authorized.
- 3. Motor vehicles must park in designated parking spaces. No right lane parking is authorized. No parking, loading, or unloading in the Island Explorer Designated Bus Stops/Spaces is authorized.
- 4. RM Group size is limited to 15 participants including the guide(s) unless the groups are participating in prearranged programs with the National Park Service staff or Schoodic Institute staff at the Schoodic Education and Research Center (SERC) campus or (2) sponsored programs with National Park Service staff or Schoodic Institute staff at the Schoodic Education and Research Center (SERC) campus. Additional restrictions may apply for group size in excess of 15 participants including the guides.
- 5. RM Staging location for the Schoodic District of the Acadia NP is the Schoodic Woods Day Use Parking Lot.
- 6. Schoodic Education and Research Center (SERC): Commercial Use Activity is prohibited from SERC campus unless the commercial use activity is (1) participating in pre-arranged programs with the National Park Service staff or Schoodic Institute staff at the SERC campus or (2) sponsored programs with National Park Service staff or Schoodic Institute staff at the SERC campus.
- 7.RM Frazer Point Dock cannot be used for commercial use activity.
- 8. RM Trailers:
  - a. Trailers are permitted only at the Schoodic Woods Day Use area.

- b. An exception: Trailers are authorized to travel on Schoodic District Loop Road beyond Frazer Point for the purpose of transport to the SERC Campus if the commercial use activity is (1) participating in pre-arranged programs with the National Park Service staff or Schoodic Institute staff at the SERC campus or (2) sponsored programs with National Park Service staff or Schoodic Institute staff at the SERC campus. SERC is the only area for unloading, loading, and parking of a trailer when the commercial use activity meets the condition of the exception.
- 9. All islands are closed to commercial use activity to include, Little Moose Island, Rolling Island, Schoodic Island, West Pond Island, Sargeant Island, and Isle of Or.
- 10. Raven's Nest is closed to commercial use activity.
- 11. All financial transactions conducted under this CUA shall begin and end outside the Schoodic District.
- 12. All park entrance and commercial tour fees apply and are available for purchase at the Schoodic Woods Campground Ranger Station from the Wednesday before Memorial Day through Indigenous People's Day in October.

#### Section C: Additional Special Park Conditions for All Activities Conducted under this CUA

- 1. **RM** Be Prepared: The CUA Holder is required to show the complete and fully executed CUA while operating within Acadia National Park.
- 2. 1 A Time Entry Vehicle Reservation to access Cadillac Summit Road is required between mid-May to mid-October. Please visit the following web site for information:

- 4. This CUA is only applicable for the activity and use of the area(s) and terms designated in this CUA.
- 5. **RM** Wetlands: Commercial Use Authorization Holders are prohibited from leading tours or permitting their passengers to enter all freshwater wetlands.
- 6. **Mildlife:** Observe wildlife from a distance; viewing of wildlife with an artificial light or using wildlife vocalization is prohibited; Disturbing or feeding wildlife is prohibited.
- 7. RM Collecting natural or cultural objects is prohibited.
- 8. **Trails:** Stay on designated trails, Step on durable rock surfaces; Look up for blazes and cairns that mark the trail; Take breaks on durable rock surfaces that accommodate your entire group;

To add or build cairns or other rock objects is prohibited.

- 9. RM\_CUA Holders must not impede traffic.
- 10. **RM** Parking: Parking is authorized in designated paved parking spaces.
- 11. RM Acknowledgement: Facilities including restrooms located in the park may not be open and available to the public during winter and shoulder seasons. Please check the ACAD website for details: <a href="https://www.nps.gov/acad/planyourvisit/hours.htm">https://www.nps.gov/acad/planyourvisit/hours.htm</a>; or follow acadianps on Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram

- 12. Provision of Services: Only the CUA Holder registered under this CUA is authorized to provide services specified in this CUA. The CUA Holder shall not subcontract or otherwise allow outside entities and/or non-registered employees to provide any services under the auspices of this CUA. The CUA Holder registered under this CUA shall not provide any services other than those specified within the Specific Conditions of this CUA unless specifically authorized by prior written agreement and approval by the National Park Service (NPS).
- 13. CUA Holder shall provide necessary first aid supplies appropriate for the activity and size of the group. A first aid kit is required to be available and adequate for responding to minor injury situations and insect stings. Refer also to the CUA Application Form, Attachment B List of Approved Service, Additionally Required Documentation, and Fee Information
- 14. This CUA does not guarantee, reserve, or otherwise give preference for parking and no vehicles used in conjunction with activities authorized by this CUA shall be driven or temporarily left in any areas not authorized for motor vehicle travel. Oversized vehicle and trailer parking are limited throughout Acadia National Park.
- 15. 7 M Engine Idling, Stopping, and Safety:
  - a. Engine idling is prohibited throughout the park; vehicle engines must be turned off when parked.
  - b. Stopping or parking in an area that creates an impediment to vehicle movement or endangers pedestrian safety is prohibited.
  - c. In accordance with Maine state law motorists must give at least 3 feet (0.9 m) clearance when passing cyclists and pedestrians.
  - d. Yield to pedestrians, cyclists, and horses at crosswalks.
  - e. Obey all posted speed limits.
  - f. Unless an emergency, there is absolutely no stopping allowed in the Left Lane of either the oneway or two-way sections of the Park Loop Road.

## 16. RM Violations:

- a. Traffic violations shall be written to the driver.
- Non-traffic violations of this CUA shall be written to the CUA holder.
- c. Three violations within the year of this authorization by the CUA Holder shall result in revocation of this CUA or additional monitoring at the CUA Holder's expense.
- 17. RM This CUA does not guarantee, reserve, or otherwise give preference for parking and is subject to park closures.
- 18. RM Tour routes, tour frequency, and other operational matters are subject to review and revised as circumstances arise. This CUA is subject to change per National Park Service discretion.
- 19. RM All financial transactions conducted under this CUA shall begin and end outside of Acadia National Park.
- 20. RM Marketing/Publicity: The CUA Holder shall not publicize, or otherwise circulate, promotional material (such as advertisements, sales brochures, press releases, speeches, still and motion pictures, articles, manuscripts or other publications, or social media outlets) which state or imply United States Governmental, Departmental, Bureau, or United States Government employee endorsement of a product, service, or position which the CUA Holder represents. No release of information relating to this authorization shall state or imply that the United States Government approves of the CUA Holder's work product or considers the CUA Holder's work to be superior to other products, or services.
- 21. **The 2023 Annual Survey Report 10-660** must be completed after the authorized CUA Holder's 2023 operating season and prior to **December 31, 2023.**

6. <u>RM</u> Itineraries: The CUA Holder is required to submit a trip itinerary, including dates, times, locations, and routes to the Acadia National Park Commercial Use Program Coordinator. Any changes to the itinerary must be submitted at least seven (7) dates prior to the proposed trip.

- 7. RM Park Entrance Fees are Required to Enter Acadia National Park.
  - a. All operators must obtain the Park entrance pass.
  - b. Fees can be paid at (1) Sand Beach Entrance Station and (2) at the Hulls Cove Visitor Center; for dates and hours of operations please check the following website:

c. For Commercial Tours the Commercial Tour Fee Schedule applies and is based on the capacity of the vehicle:

- d. For Transportation Providers Non-Commercial Tours please visit Fees & Passes Acadia National Park (U.S. National Park Service) (nps.gov)
- e. The fee to enter the park is valid for entrance for one group only. In the event of any change to the tour manifest (i.e., the same bus with a different set of passengers), a new fee to enter the park must be paid.
- f. Vehicle Entrance Pass Hang Tags must be displayed at all times while traveling in the park.
- Wetlands: Commercial Use Authorization Holders are prohibited from leading tours or permitting their passengers to enter all freshwater wetlands.
- Wildlife: Observe wildlife from a distance; viewing of wildlife with an artificial light or using wildlife vocalization is prohibited; Disturbing or feeding wildlife is prohibited.
- 10. **?M** Collecting natural or cultural objects is prohibited.
- 11. Trails: Stay on designated trails, Step on durable rock surfaces; Look up for blazes and cairns that mark the trail; Take breaks on durable rock surfaces that accommodate your entire group; to add or build

cairns or other rock objects is prohibited.

- 12. <a href="#">RM</a> Transportation Operators/Tour Operators are <a href="#">not authorized</a> to <a href="#">Impede Traffic</a>.
- 13. **Parking:** Parking is authorized in designated paved parking spaces or designated bus parking area zones.
- 14. Acknowledgement: Facilities including restrooms located in the park may not be open and available to the public during winter and shoulder seasons. Please check the ACAD website for details: <a href="https://www.nps.gov/acad/planyourvisit/hours.htm">https://www.facebook.com/AcadiaNPS</a>

- Provision of Services: Only the CUA Holder registered under this CUA is authorized to provide services specified in this CUA. - 16. CUA Holder shall provide necessary first aid supplies appropriate for the activity and size of the group. A first aid kit is required to be available and adequate for responding to minor injury situations and insect stings. Refer also to CUA Application Form, Attachment B List of Approved Service, Additionally Required Documentation and Fee Information
- This CUA does not guarantee, reserve, or otherwise give preference for parking and no vehicles used in conjunction with activities authorized by this CUA shall be driven or temporarily left in any areas not authorized for motor vehicle travel. Oversized vehicle and trailer parking are limited.
- 18. RM Engine Idling, Stopping, and Safety:
  - Engine idling is prohibited throughout the park; vehicle engines must be turned off when parked.
  - b. Stopping or parking in an area that creates an impediment to vehicle movement or endangers pedestrian safety is prohibited.
  - c. In accordance with Maine state law motorists must give at least 3 feet (0.9 m) clearance when passing cyclists and pedestrians.
  - d. Yield to pedestrians, cyclists, and horses at crosswalks.
  - e. Obey all posted speed limits
  - f. Unless an emergency, there is absolutely no stopping allowed in the Left Lane of either the one-way or two-way sections of the Park Loop Road.

## 19. RM Violations:


a. Traffic violations shall be written to the driver

- 21. Tour routes, tour frequency, and other operational matters are subject to review and revision as circumstances arise. This Authorization is subject to change per National Park Service discretion.
- 22. RM All financial transactions conducted under this CUA shall begin and end outside of Acadia National Park.
- 23. Marketing/Publicity: The CUA Holder shall not publicize, or otherwise circulate, promotional material (such as advertisements, sales brochures, press releases, speeches, still and motion pictures, articles, manuscripts or other publications, or social media outlets) which state or imply United States Governmental, Departmental, Bureau, or United States Government employee endorsement of a product, service, or position which the CUA Holder represents.

No release of information relating to this authorization shall state or imply that the United States Government approves of the CUA Holder's work product or considers the CUA Holder's work to be superior to other products, or services.

24. The 2023 Annual Survey Report 10-660 must be completed after the authorized CUA Holder's 2023 operating season and prior to December 31, 2023.
